# NATURAL DISASTER & EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

At our January meeting, we had the pleasure of having local emergency preparedness coordinator Sean Smith give a presentation on how to prepare and be properly outfitted for an emergency situation or natural disaster.

The following are some tips Sean shared with us to be properly prepared:

- Have 72 hours of food and water on hand for each member of your household
- Have a plan for evacuation & reuniting, and review it periodically with your family  $\vec{k}$
- Keep an emergency kit in your home, and a smaller kit in each vehicle
- Keep important documents in an airtight bag so they are easy to grab in an emergency situation, OR keep your family's vital documents on an encrypted flash drive in a secondary location such as a safety deposit box
- Never let the gas tank in your car get below ½ tank so you are ready to evacuate at any time
- Remember to update your emergency kits once a year to replace expired food and medications

#### EMERGENCY KITS SHOULD INCLUDE ITEMS SUCH AS:

- Headlamp and flashlight
- Fire starter kit
- AM/FM weatherband radio
- Solar adapter to charge phones
- Emergency whistle
- Paracord
- Water purification system & water bottles for storing clean drinking water
- Food dehydrated food, MREs, Beef jerky, nuts, dried fruit, protein bars, etc.
- First aid kit with a trauma kit (Pro Tip: tampons are useful for plugging puncture wounds)
- Heat source for cooking, such as Jetboil
- Toiletries and toilet paper
- Shoes (broken in) and extra clothes (try to avoid cotton as it loses its thermal quality when wet)
- Ziplocks and garbage bags to protect electronics
- Visquene or tarps great for waterproofing makeshift shelters
